Statewide Discussion:

Fire danger will be limited today by somewhat cooler temperatures, elevated relative humidity and generally light winds resulting in the anticipation of no significant fire activity today across Oklahoma. Scattered light precipitation earlier this morning in both north-central and west-central Oklahoma combined with rain shower and thunderstorm chances building in this afternoon and evening hold promise of improving fuel moisture for a period.

Temperature readings across the state are forecast to be in the mid- to upper-70's across Oklahoma excluding counties along the Red River where 80°-84° is expected. Relative humidity values are not expected to fall below 40% and sky cover may hang around until later in the day combining to hold fine fuel moisture above levels of concern. Continuing with the trend as of late, winds are not expected to be above 10 mph with limited gusting, and will keep potential rates of fire spread in check.
